

AN ACT

We prohibit intesticating beverages, and to regulate the montheture, preductive, use, and sale of high-posed spirits for other than beverage perposes, and to insure on angle supply of alcohol and prenets its use in admitting monach and in the development of facil, dyn, and other harful industries.

By it exacted by the Senate and Mouse of Representatives of the Uniter Status of America in Congress essential, That the short title of this Act shall be the "National Prohibition Act."

TITLE L.

TO PROVIDE FOR THE EXPORCEMENT OF WAR PROMINETION.

The term "Wer Prohibition Act" need in this Act shall mean the provisions of any Act or Acts prohibiting the sale and manufacture of interiesting Equars until the conclusion of the present war and thereafter until the termination of denself-likation, the date of which shall be determined and preclaimed by the Precificant of the United Stanse. The words "beer, when, we other interiesting mails or vinctus liquers" in the War Prohibition Act shall be hereafter construct to mean any such howenges which contain suc-half of 1 per resultant or more of alcohod by volume: *Provisied*, That the imagoing definition shall not extend to descheduled with net to any howenge or liquid produced by the process by which here, ale, porter or wine is produced, if its contains less then one-half of 1 per cost on of alcohod by volume, and is made as prescribed in action 37 of Title II of this Act, and is colorwise demarimized than as beer, ale, or porter, and is contained and sold in, or from, who wall and labeled bottles, casks, or containers as the commissioner way by waylation prescribe.
